1 Welcome by the Chairman of Fremington Parish Council

Mr Biederman reported that the group has not got a secretary and did lose some members, however, some new volunteers have come forward and the group held the Christmas Lights Switch on Event, its annual Easter Egg Hunt and three community tidy up events. The group is hoping to build on these events during the forthcoming year and is looking to organise a summer event.
- Fremington Parish Hall Management Committee, Mr Samuel Adams, Chairman

- Tomlin Hall Management Committee, Mr Marc Binns, Chairman

Mr Binns added that the venue is functioning well as a Village Hall and is one of the few remaining venues to offer dog training, however, the hall has funding and planning permission for renovations and will need to consider how the transition is managed as it is likely that the hall will not be available for some time.
- Fremington Riverside Park and Waters Edge Residents Association, Mr Jeff Bridgeman, Chairman

Attached as Appendix E. Mr Wilson added that lots of work had been undertaken at the Heritage Centre, there is now a visitors' book and whilst he acknowledged that 80% of comments probably relate to the



café 20% did relate to the Heritage Centre and it is being used a resource. The group has funding to undertake a survey of Fishleigh Quay and are looking to start a "Friends of Fremington Quay" group.

- Lagoon View Community Orchard Group, Mr John Wilson Attached as Appendix F. Mr Wilson added that the group is currently trying to regain ownership of the piece of land which has been used by the community in excess of ten years, however, the developer sees it as a road through to another development.
